Bridging the Gap (BTG) Medical Interpreter Training

Program is a professional development course created by The Cross Cultural Health Care Program (CCHCP) that trains bilingual individuals to become a professionally trained medical and community interpreter.

Students will learn various skills and topics required for successful interpreting in the medical field and other settings including social services and education.

The Bridging the Gap courses qualify as prerequisites for the national certifications provided by the National Board of Certification for Medical Interpreters (NBCMI) and the Certification Commission for Health Care Interpreters (CCHI).

Bridging the Gap Medical Interpreting covers:

- Introduction to Critical Interpreting Skills
- Code of Ethics for Professional Interpreters
- Integrated medical terminology, anatomy, and physiology
- An overview of the U.S. Healthcare System
- Culture and its Impact on Interpreting
- Communication Skills for Advocacy
- Professional Development

Interpreting in Mental Health (covered in BTG 64HR and BTG 24HR Mental Health Interpreting ONLY)

BTG is taught in English and is open to bilingual speakers of all languages. No medical interpreting experience is required.
