WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION

Special education and IEP meetings require interpreters to navigate complex terminology, legal requirements, emotionally sensitive conversations, and high-stakes decisions that impact a student's educational path. These meetings often include multiple team members, detailed evaluation reports, and structured discussions about eligibility, services, goals, and placement.

This interactive workshop provides interpreters with a practical overview of the special education process and the structure of IEP meetings. Participants will gain an understanding of the purpose of these meetings, review commonly used terminology and acronyms, and examine professional boundaries and ethical considerations in school-based settings. The training also addresses real-world challenges and includes guided role-play practice for IEP meetings.

KEY OBJECTIVES

By the end of this workshop, participants will be able to:

- Understand the purpose and structure of special education and IEP meetings.
- Identify and interpret key terminology and concepts used in IEP and 504 meetings.
- Recognize common challenges in special education interpreting and apply practical strategies to manage them.
- Apply professional ethical standards and maintain appropriate boundaries in school-based meetings.
- Practice interpreting IEP meetings through guided role-play exercises.
